

What is ADOBE on My Bank Statement?

ADOBE or **ADOBE SYSTEMS** is a billing label used for subscriptions to Adobe products like Photoshop, Illustrator, Acrobat Pro, and Creative Cloud. The charge typically recurs monthly or annually depending on your plan.

Why Am I Being Charged by Adobe?

Common reasons for Adobe charges include:

- Creative Cloud subscription (All Apps or Single App)
- Adobe Acrobat Pro DC subscription
- Annual renewal for a photography or video editing plan
- Free trial that converted to a paid plan

What is Adobe?

Adobe is a software company known for its design and productivity tools. Creative professionals, marketers, and businesses use Adobe apps for photo editing, graphic design, PDF management, video production, and more.

Is the Adobe Charge Legit?

Most of the time, yes. If you don't recognize the charge, check whether someone else in your household or company signed up. Visit account.adobe.com to see your subscription and billing details.

How to Cancel an Adobe Subscription

To stop future Adobe charges:

- Log into your account at account.adobe.com
- Click **Plans**, then **Manage Plan**
- Select **Cancel Plan** and follow the prompts
