


Why Is EVERIMAYMQE on My Credit Card?

Short answer: It might be Fotor.com or Clipify.ai.



If you're seeing **EVERIMAYMQE** on your credit card statement, you're probably thinking: "What the heck is that?" Same. In my case, it turned out to be **Fotor.com** (the photo editor / design tool). The charge wasn't labeled "Fotor" on my statement. It showed up as EVERIMAYMQE instead, which made it look like a random scam charge.

Important: I can't say this is *always* Fotor for everyone. Merchants and payment processors sometimes show weird "descriptor" names that don't match the brand you recognize. But if you've used Fotor recently (free trial, subscription, one-time export, etc.), it's a strong clue.

What To Do Next:

- Search your email for "Fotor" receipts, invoices, or trial confirmations.
- Check your Fotor account billing/subscription page.
- If you still can't match it to something you authorized, contact your card issuer and dispute the charge.
