It just means that a company you bought a product from is using Pitney Bowes to help them send the package to you. It's just the third-party system, so you might see it mentioned. It doesn't mean a whole lot, so you can just ignore it if you like.

What is Pitney Bowes?

Pitney Bowes is a technology and mailing services company. They provide postage meters, mailing systems, and logistics solutions — including shipping services for many large businesses.

In plain English? **They don't send you the mail — they send it on behalf of someone else.**

Why Their Name Shows Up in USPS Emails

When a company uses Pitney Bowes to print postage, sort mail, or ship items, Pitney Bowes often appears as the sender in your USPS Informed Delivery preview — even if the actual sender is someone else entirely. They are the service being used, and the package is most likely not from them.

Common examples include:

- Credit card companies
- Insurance providers

- Government agencies
- Retailers and fulfillment centers

USPS doesn't always include the real sender's name in those daily previews — especially when the mail is processed by a third-party logistics company like Pitney Bowes.

Is It a Scam?

Nope — seeing “PITNEY BOWES, INC” listed in your daily USPS email is totally normal. It just means they handled the mailing. You'll usually find out who really sent it once you get the physical envelope or package.

What to Do If You're Still Unsure

If you're curious or concerned about what's arriving, wait until the mail is delivered and check the return address. In most cases, it's routine stuff like bills, official notices, or junk mail.

And if it turns out to be something unexpected? At least you didn't have to guess anymore.
